## **KRISTIAN BENEDIKT**



Lithuanian tenor Kristian Benedikt has built up a reputation as one of the leading international singers Verdi's Otello.

He sang this most demanding role more than 100 times: at Wiener Staatsoper, Bavarian State Opera Munich, at the Mariinski Theatre in St. Petersburg, Modena, Piacenza, Cagliari, Palermo, Ekaterinenburg, Santiago de Chile, Vilnius, Graz, Basel, Stockholm, Latvian Opera Festival and at Victoria's Pacific Opera, Montreal Opera, Savonlinna Festival etc.

During last two years he has debuted in London Royal Covent Garden Opera with the role of Canio (conductor A. Pappano, staging of D. Michieletto), sang Otello in Wiener Staatspoer (cond. M. Subsequently he was guesting Mariinsky Theatre in St. Petersburg, at most opera houses of the Baltic countries.

He has performed under the baton of conductors such as Antonio Pappano, Marco Armiliato, Marcello Votti, Riccardo Chailly, Maurizio Barbacini, Paolo Carigniani, Asher Fisch, Renato Palumbo, Valeri Gergiev, Alexander Vedernikov and is working with stage directors like Giancarlo del Monaco, Damiano Michieletto, Willy Decker, David Alden, Calixto Bieito, Hugo de Ana, Dmitri Bertman, Eimuntas Nekrošius or Pier Francesco Maestrini.
